

HOM-SIGMAA Business Meeting
Thursday, August 4, 2022

Minutes

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Ximena Catepillán at 5:10pm.

1. Introductions: Dr. Catepillán introduced those members of the HOM-SIGMAA executive board who were in attendance - herself as Chair, and Dr. Antonia Cardwell as Electronic Resources Coordinator.
2. Announcements:
 1. Virtual Lecture Series - Our Virtual Lecture Series will continue on the first Wednesdays of almost every month.
 2. Student Paper Contest - The winners of the 2022 contest are Rye Ledford from University of Missouri and Sarah Sanfranski of the University of Redlands. The papers will be published in Convergence. The deadline for the 20th paper contest is in March 2023, and details will appear on our website, homsigmaa.net.
 3. New Student Paper Contest - We are sponsoring a new Student Paper Contest that will start in Fall 2023. The topic will be Islamic/Arabic Mathematics, 8th-16th century. This contest was created by Naser Al-Hasan and Nuh Aydin. Details will appear on our website, homsigmaa.net.
 4. HOM-SIGMAA Grants - HOM-SIGMAA has two types of grants: The Small Student Grants (classroom items that will aid in the teaching of history of math) and Student Travel Grants. Details are on our website, homsigmaa.net.
